**Topic: Personality Testing (Interpretation & Incorporation with Assessment) –26 August 2011**

Psychological assessment is a complex process to which psychometrics can make a significant contribution. Personality testing involves measurement of enduring personal characteristics and traits, implying recurrent behavioural patterns and likely responses to stimuli. Personality assessment may involve use of clinical interviews, self-report questionnaires and psychometrics, and can contribute to psychological formulation and diagnosis. Participants will refine their use of psychometrics in assessment of personality. Participants will learn how to incorporate test results into a coherent model of psychological assessment, utilising evidence from a variety of sources. Objective and projective methods of assessment will be contrasted. The use of unidimensional state scales will be contextualised. Participants will learn how to use the *Minnesota Multiphasic Personality Inventory - 2*, with reference to the use of the more recent version, *MMPI-2-RF*, and the *Millon Clinical Multiaxial Inventory - III*. Review of sample cases will assist participants to refine skills in writing and reporting their findings, including use of technical addenda to report scores to other psychologists.
